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1 Introduction

The Dulacca Wind Farm Project involves the construction and operation of a wind farm consisting of 43 wind turbines. Construction on the site commenced on 5 October 2021 (commencement of the action) with all relevant plans published on the Dulacca Wind Farm website, https://www.dulaccawindfarm.com.au/. Construction of the wind farm is still in progress, with practical completion of the wind farm and commencement of operations currently scheduled for early 2023.

This Annual Compliance Report covers the reporting period between 5 October 2021 - 6 October 2022. This report has been prepared by Dulacca Energy Project Co Pty Ltd (ACN 643 652 368) as per the EPBC approval granted for the Dulacca Renewable Energy Project (EPBC 2018/8368).

In accordance with the approval granted on the 21 August 2020 under the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Act 1999* (EPBC Act), this Annual Compliance Report has been prepared in response to Condition 27 of the approval which states:

"The approval holder must prepare a compliance report for each 12-month period following the date of commencement of the action, or otherwise in accordance with an annual date that has been agreed to in writing by the Minister. The approval holder must:

a. publish each **compliance report** on the **website** within 60 **business days** following the relevant 12-month period"

1.1 EPBC Approval

Dulacca Energy Project Co Pty Ltd, as the Proponent of the Project (EPBC 2018/8368) was issued with an approval by the Department of Agriculture, Water and the Environment (now the Department of Climate Change, Energy, the Environment and Water) (the Department) on the 21 August 2020. An additional variation to the approval was made on 30 July 2021, approved by A/Assistant Secretary, which updated conditions 1, 3, 4, 5, 6, 9, 10 and 11 and added conditions 25A, 25B, 25C, 25D, and 25E.

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3 New Environmental Risks

At this stage of the Project, no new environmental risks have been identified. This is the first compliance report for the Project and the Bird and Bat Utilisation Survey Reports found all turbines within the study area are considered to meeting the EPBC Act approval condition of low-risk turbines. During the next reporting period, Dulacca will be transitioning into the operational phase of the Project. The operational phase is considered to present lowered environmental risk as construction and vegetation clearing activities will have ceased.
